SOUTHERN ARM TRUNK MAIN WORKS CONTINUE

Stage 1 works on the \$25 million Southern Arm Trunk Main water pipeline continues with the next phase of construction works to include the installation of the large 750mm trunkmain, which extend this new pipeline from Houston Mitchell Drive and Bonny View Drive to the Bonny Hills reservoir.

Residents are advised that heavy trucks will be delivering and unloading sections of pipe in the Bonny Hills area from June 21st. These pipe deliveries may result in some disruption to traffic along Ocean Drive & McGilvray Road. Residents are requested to exercise patience and caution and to also follow traffic directions during these pipe delivery activities.
